#### Pyramid Lake Housing Authority—2008 Annual Performance Report

Mission Statement – The Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe is committed to providing the opportunity for safe, decent, sanitary, and affordable housing for tribal members and to do so in a way that is consistent with the Tribe's social, cultural and economic values.

The Pyramid Lake Housing Authority (PLHA) was established by Ordinance No.X adopted by the Pyramid Lake Tribal Council February 1963. Article IV of the Ordinance established a Board of Commissioners composed of five persons. Monthly Board meetings are held the fourth Tuesday of each month at 4 pm in the Housing conference room. The Tribal Council has previously designated the PLHA as the Tribe's Tribal Designated Housing Entity (TDHE) under Resolution No. PL 72-97. PLHA has been in operation for 45 years.

The current PLHA Board of Commissioners are Dean Calvin, Chairperson; Robert James, Vice-Chairperson; Judith Davis, Secretary/Treasurer; Leona Collins, Commissioner; and Edward Ely III, Commissioner. Each Commissioner serves a four year term.

The PLHA staff consists of ten full time employees. Christine John, Executive Director; Jill Mix, Finance Manager; Mary Ann Frazier, Administrative Assistant; Jackie Phoenix, Development Coordinator; Emma Powell, Dev. Assistant; Judy Thomas, Housing Services Specialist; Lynette Blossom, Housing Services

Specialist; Josh Davis, Supervisor-Maint.; Jake Hill, Maint.Tech; and Steve Mandell, Maint.Tech.

As of 12.31.08, there are 199 units under management. 151 are homeownership units and 48 are rental (12 single dwelling and 36 townhouse apartments) units. The occupancy rate for the homeownership program and the 12 single dwelling rental units is 100%. The townhouse rental apartments average a 80% occupancy rate. Presently, all the apartments are occupied except for three. These units are under renovation. The potential tenants have been selected and are scheduled to occupy in April.

#### **Goals and Objectives:**

- To maintain current assisted housing stock (units under management). Annual inspections were completed by the Resident Services department for both low rent units and homeownership units. The FY08 Waiting List for both programs were completed and approved by the BOC in April '08.
- To maintain other housing stock by providing modernization programs for home repair/ replacement and to identify a source of funding for the homeowners. The Elder/Handicap Housing Assistance Program (HAP) has been established as well as the Elders' Home Protection (Amerind) Program.
- 3. To maintain the professional integrity and

businesslike atmosphere of the Housing Authority by managing and operating the tribal housing program according to polices and procedures and within budget. Strive to maintain open communication with the various agencies; provide training opportunities for the staff and continue resident interaction to insure open communication.

- 4. New Construction build homeownership and rental units which are affordable for potential homebuyers and/or renters and identify funds to do so. The request for proposals is being published for the services of an architectural firm; ground breaking is scheduled for early spring.
- Contribute to the economic advancement of our membership by utilizing the local qualified labor force for housing activities when possible.
- Create and implement the 184 loan program and other resources to address the housing need.

PLHA administers, on behalf of the Tribe, Indian Health Service projects and the Bureau of Indian Affairs Housing Improvement Programs (HIP). The FY08 Project Summary Listing details the various projects which were completed in 2008. Also listed are the projects which will be carried over and completed in FY09.



## Native American Youth Healing Quilt Hope for Families......Hope for our Future...

I would like to introduce an idea called the Healing Quilt. The Healing quilt is a blanket of hope for families who have lost a child or teen before their time. Many of our children die young due to illness, accidents, suicide, murder and or alcohol & drug related deaths. Families who have lost a loved one need time to heal. The death of a child is a devastating ordeal to endure. As a mother and grandmother, I cannot imagine what the pain would be like to lose one of my children or grandchildren. But I have sisters and brothers who have lost young ones and I know how these deaths can affect families.

The beginning: Each family would have to make or sew one 12 inches by 12 inches quilt square (the pieces will be provided). The quilt square will honor your loved one by placing their name, birth date, death date, tribal affiliation and how they died. Some families may even want to have a photo of their loved one silk screened onto their square. Once the squares are complete they will be added to the original quilt. The quilt squares are available on a first come first served basis. The finished quilt will hang somewhere in a place of honor. The quilt will be used as a teaching tool to show other native youth that they don't need to be memorialized in this way; if they can learn to live a good life, make good choices and grow old as the Creator intends all of us to do.... 
